Congratulations on your engagement!

The pastor & members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church are pleased to help you prepare for your wedding day, and your marriage. This booklet is provided to aid you in your planning, and to familiarize you with the wedding policies of this congregation.

Marriage is a gift of God, intended for the joy and mutual strength of those who enter it and for the well-being of the whole human family... Marriage is also a human estate, with vows publicly witnessed. The church in worship surrounds these promises with the gathering of God's people, the witness of word and God, and prayers of blessings and intercession (Evangelical Lutheran Worship 2006, page 286).

Since you are planning a wedding in and through the church, it is assumed that you desire to recognize God's part not only the wedding itself but also your marriage to come. Your wedding is about you as a couple, but it is also bigger than you as a couple. A wedding is a worship service. It is here we gather together in Christ's name to recognize and honor God's intention for humans to be a part of intimate, long-lasting, mutually edifying relationships. The service itself is usually very brief; even the longest form of the actual service requires only around 30 minutes. That brief time--out of months of preparation--ought to therefore be dedicated to God, God's word, and God's blessings.

In this Wedding Booklet...

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I. PLANNING AHEAD

Wedding Date

Your first contact should be with the pastor, to set the date of your wedding. Do not reserve the hall, the photographer, etc. until you have set the date with the pastor! Plan ahead as early as possible. The pastor will try to accommodate you, but the later you make these arrangements, the more likely scheduling conflicts arise. A date and time for the rehearsal will also need to be established. *Traditionally, weddings are not celebrated during Lent, the six weeks before Easter.*

Pre-Marital Counseling

Three meetings will be scheduled with the pastor before the wedding, for the purpose of pre-marriage counseling (two meetings) and wedding planning (final meeting). The initial conversation with the pastor will help establish what form these three sessions will take. The final session will be scheduled within a month of the wedding in order to cover final details. It is your responsibility to schedule these meetings with the pastor.

Organist/Music

You will need to contact your own musicians. Please do so as soon as possible (ideally 6 months prior) to ensure that they have sufficient time to meet with you and prepare the music. All music must be approved by the pastor. We have several organists/pianists currently serving in our congregation, who may be available. We can provide their contact information to you if you wish. While Our Savior's is now set up to provide quality music from cd or other digital source, a live musician is strongly encouraged.

II. SCHEDULE OF FEES - Members

Members of Our Savior's will pay a deposit of **\$250.00**, due immediately to reserve the church and date. Checks can be made payable to: *Our Savior's Lutheran Church*. Unused portions of the deposit will be returned to the couple within 2 weeks after the wedding day.

The following items will be deducted from the deposit if not used:

Building Usage Fee: \$ 100.00

Pastoral Services No Fee Required

Typical Gratuity (thanks offering) is \$125 - \$225

Pre-marriage Resources \$25.00

Weddings Bulletins: \$50.00

Custodial Fee \$75.00

The following items are an extra fee that isn't included in the deposit:

Organist (rehearsal & wedding): \$ 125.00

Soloist: **\$ 50.00**

(plus \$25 for each additional rehearsal & each practice with a soloist. There will be an additional charge of \$25 for any time exceeding 1 hr.)

III. SCHEDULE OF FEES - Non-Members

Non-members will pay a deposit of **\$550.00**, due immediately to reserve the church. Checks can be made payable to: *Our Savior's Lutheran Church*. Unused portions of the deposit will be returned to the couple within 2 weeks after the wedding day.

The following items will be deducted from the deposit:

The following items are an extra fee that isn't included in the deposit:

(plus \$25 for each additional rehearsal & each practice with a soloist. There will be an additional charge of \$25 for any time exceeding 1 hr.)

IV. WEDDING POLICIES

- 1. The use of alcoholic beverages is prohibited at the church or on the grounds with the exception of wine for Holy Communion. The pastor will not proceed with the rehearsal or the wedding if anyone in the wedding party is believed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- 2. **Smoking is prohibited indoors**. Please remind your guests to respect this rule, and smoke only out of doors. Also, please do not leave crushed out cigarettes on the sidewalks. **Pop cans are also prohibited in the church worship area.**
- 3. **The conduct of all participants** should be in keeping with the spirit of worship. The pastor reserves the right to halt any service when a member of the party or any guests in the church are not conducting themselves with propriety.
- 4. **Picture taking** during the wedding service is discouraged. Only the designated photographer is allowed to take pictures from half-way down the aisle during the <u>processional</u> and <u>recessional</u>. The photographer is permitted to take pictures during the service <u>without a flash</u> from the balcony or rear of the sanctuary.
- 5. **Video equipment** may be used from the balcony during the service. For the <u>processional</u> and <u>recessional</u>, it may be used half-way down the aisle, with the video photographer standing inside the end of a pew.
- 6. **The throwing of rice** is discouraged as it is messy, and possibly harmful to the birds. For those reasons, we ask that you not throw rice. Flower petals can be used, as long as the wedding party cleans them up.
- 7. **The pastor of Our Savior's** will be the officiating minister at all weddings in the congregation, unless direct arrangements are made with him. If you wish to have another minister or priest participate as the assisting minister, it should be at the invitation of the pastor of this parish.

V. WORSHIP SERVICE

The marriage service is found on page 286 in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship Hymnal. The basic format is as follows (with a * designating items which are optional):

The marriage service in Evangelical Lutheran worship is one in which the guests are not mere spectators, but participants in worship. You are encouraged to consider the use of congregational hymns and the celebration of Holy Communion at the service. The liturgy of Holy Communion stresses several important themes: the centrality of Christ in your relationship, the love of God, unity, and forgiveness. It can be a very meaningful symbol to participate in this sacrament of one's wedding day. The use of a unity candle, while not a historic Christian symbol, is an accepted practice. Bulletins are not required, but many people find them helpful. You may produce them yourselves, or have them done at the church (fee). The pastor will plan the worship with you.

VI. SUGGESTED READINGS & HYMNS

Readings from Scripture are an important part of the worship. Scripture readings may be proclaimed by those who read with confidence from among family members, members of the wedding party, and others. If the last reading is from the gospels, it is normally proclaimed by the minister who is preaching. The assembly stands for this reading.

Suggested Scripture Readings

It is suggested that you read these together and choose several that are meaningful to you. It is traditional (though not required) to have 3 readings: First Lesson, Second Lesson, and Gospel. A Psalm may also be chosen.

SUGGESTED MUSIC

Music is a beautiful (but not required) aspect of any wedding service. Below is a list of suggested congregational hymns. Your musician can give you ideas of instrumental music you might use for your processional or recessional. You are responsible for the purchase of copies of any vocal or solo music you select (usually one for the vocalist and one for the accompanist).

Vocal Solos/Duets

Besides congregational hymns, couples sometimes request to include other music from the wider culture. It is understood that contemporary songs can hold significant meaningful to couples. Remember that your wedding is a worship service when considering such additional songs. The reception or dance is another appropriate venue for the use of many contemporary songs. The final approval of all music for the wedding ceremony itself must come from the pastor.

VII. SUGGESTED VOWS

The vows that you make to one another are at the heart of the wedding service. The words should reflect your relationship. You may choose to use any of the vows below, combine them, or write your own:

- 1. I take you, *name*, to be my *wife/husband* from this day forward, to join with you and share all that is to come, and I promise to be faithful to you until death parts us.
- 2. In the presence of God and this community, I, name, take you, name, to be my wife/husband; to have and to hold from this day forward, in joy and in sorrow, in plenty and in want, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, as long as we both shall live. This is my solemn yow.
- 3. I take you (name) to be my wife/husband from this day onward, to join with you and share all that is to come, to give and to receive, to speak and to listen, to inspire and to respond, and in all circumstances of our life together to be loyal to you with my whole life and with all my being.
- 4. I take you (name) to be my wife/husband, I promise before God and these witnesses to be your faithful husband/wife, to share with you in plenty and in want, in joy and in sorrow, in sickness and in health, to forgive and strengthen you, and to join with you so that together we may serve God and others as long as we both shall live.
- 5. I take you (name) to be my wife/husband, and these things I promise you: I will be faithful to you and honest with you; I will respect, trust, help, and care for you; I will share my life with you; I will forgive you as we have been forgiven; and I will try with you better to understand ourselves, the world, and God; through the best and the worst of what is to come as long as we live.
- 6. I (name) take you (name) to be my wedded wife/husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death do us part, according to God's holy ordinance these things I promise with all my heart.
- * If you choose to write your own vows, they will need to be approved by the pastor, with a printed copy being provided to the pastor prior to the rehearsal.

VIII. WEDDING REHEARSAL & MARRIAGE LICENSE

Wedding Rehearsal

The wedding rehearsal is very important. You should be sure that all who are involved in your wedding are present, including the organist, the wedding party, the parents, the ushers, and the readers. Arrangements need to be made with the office administrator for rehearsal & decorating times. The church building is locked otherwise.

Be prompt for rehearsal! If you are arranging candelabras, bows, etc. in the worship area, you will want to arrive early to do this, so that we may begin on time. Remember that the placement of all decorations must be cleared with the pastor, and that it is your responsibility to see to it that the worship space is left in its original arrangement. All decorations and candles should be purchased by you, including the unity candle (if you desire to use one). Following the service you are responsible for removing all personal items, trash and debris, and leaving the church building in the same good order as when you arrived

Marriage License

You must make application for your license at least 7 days, but no more than 30 days in advance of your wedding, according to the State of Wisconsin. Remember that a pastor cannot legally perform a wedding without the marriage license. Therefore, you should bring your license to the church no later than the wedding rehearsal.
